Cash on hand in the club treasury as of March 31st was \$3553.33.

The special events station is kicking into high gear. As the certificate manager for the SHOT chapter of 10-10, Al Mattis N5AFV wrote a piece for the 10-10 magazine announcing the Special Events Station which Bill Dessens N5KXU is chairing. Larry Levy WD5DRB has also sent in an announcement to the same publication.

There will be a Severe Weather Seminar sponsored by the Fort Bend County Office of Emergency Management which will span 2 evenings, June 8th and 9th (Monday & Tuesday) 7-10pm. This will be a more lengthy and in-depth presentation than the one which B-VARC co-sponsored last year.

Bill Kemp KG5CB, field day chairman, reported that field day is now set to be held at Bear Creek Park the last full weekend in June (June 26-28th). Currently plans are to have 4-5 stations with sign-up sheets for those who wish to work a station.
