

It was mentioned that the Houston Marathon is to be held on January 8, 1984, and that help was needed for communications.



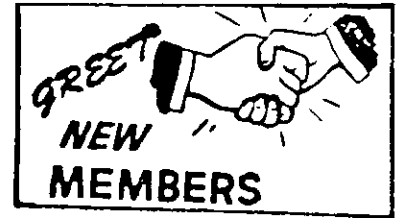

Henry Freedenberg, N5HF, recently visited ARRL Headquarters in Newington, Connecticut, and brought back with him some very helpful information. One of the most interesting items is that ARRL has for the asking, loan only, a library of audio-visual aids. These aids are rent free.

The Volunteer Examiner Program was discussed at length, with reports read from several sources.

Ron Bolyard then talked about the 1984 committee appointments.

Meeting adjourned about 10:00 PM.

We all should make a special effort to stay well informed on these issues that are so close to each of us. We should always remember that we can influence the outcome of many of these issues by making our wishes known to our Congressional Representatives and the FCC officials.

The ARRL has been the major organized effort to keep us informed and to protect the interests of all Amateur Radio Operators. B-VARC supports the ARRL as an Affiliated Club and I hope that each of you will help support the ARRL through your individual memberships.

ARRL BULLETIN NO. 135 - TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS

The FCC on December 14, 1983 voted in the strongest possible manner to retain the Morse code requirements for all classes of Amateur Radio Licenses.

Private Radio Bureau chief, Robert Foosaner said that the Radio Service is well, thriving and providing an excellent service to the American public.

He strongly recommended that the FCC maintain the code requirement, endorse the service as it is and bury the concept of "no code".

Chairman Mark Fowler stated that the code is very important and is some cases essential for getting the message through. He said further that the radio amateurs have contributed vitally to the country and recently were stalwart in performing communications with Granada!

The vote was unanimous to reject the concept of "no code".....

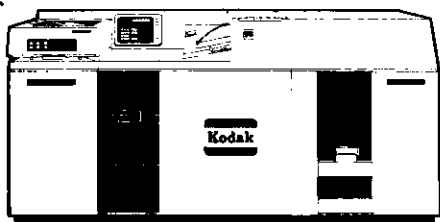

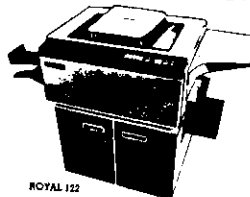
