A list of 9 amplifiers manufacturered by 6 different companies can be found in QST,Jan, 79 p. 65. Coverage on these models includes 10 meters, restricted due to abuse of amplifiers on 11 meters/C.B.... Just remember, the minimum power required is smiled upon by the FCC, fellow HAMS, and your next door neighbor with his new \$229.99 am/fm receiver built with a \$19.99 circuitry design.


