From the President, June 1980 -

The affairs of the Club appear to be in pretty good shape, and altho not overflowing the treasury appears to be adequate. Monthly meeting attendance is increasing and new members are continually being added. Up to 25+ checkins on the Monday night nets indicate a growing interest in the Club. The monthly transmitter hunts are attracting a larger number of people than actual hunters, we regret to note, and hope that will change.

taken:

2. The Club has been exempted from payment of the \$150 annual

Texas corporation franchise tax.

3. All necessary papers are in hand and ready to be filed for exemption from federal income tax.

We hope to produce it quarterly, then bi-monthly, then eventually monthly PROVIDED, HOWEVER, the membership furnishes information for publication. The hurricane season is fast approaching and it is time for all radio amateurs to check their equipment and emergency supplies. Gulf Coast area is long over due for a major storm and this could be


the year!

REPORTS FROM COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN FILED WITH BULLETIN EDITOR -

By-Laws Committee, filed July 2, 1980

When the Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club incorporated under the laws of the State of Texas, the Club's Constitution and By-Laws became obosolete. The Club's President appointed a Constitution and By-Laws Committee to look into the matter and to submit appropriate recommendations to the Board of Directors.

The Committee concluded that, since the Club was a corporation, its Articles of Incorporation replaced the Constitution of the unincorporated organization, and produced a set of proposed By-Laws for the Corporation. It was submitted to the Board of Directors with the recommendation that either it be approved and submitted to the membership of the Club for adoption or be referred back to the Committee for further action.

Monday Nite Net Moved to New Repeater

On July 21 the Monday 9 P.M. 2-meter Club net was moved to a new repeater and given a new name. The Cypress Repeater Group (CRG), operators of the 147.60/00 mHz repeater, invited us to avail ourselves of this machine for normal and emergency operations. The new name of the net is Brazos Valley Public Service Net (BVPSN).

The 60/00 repeater is located atop the Dewalt tower which is also the home of TV Channels 2, 11, and 39 and is 1,549 feet above sea level. Presently using an exceptionally low power output of about two and one-half watts, coverage is in excess of a 50-mile radius. The repeater also has a 2-meter/220 mHz link, permitting dual band operations. CRG is in the planning/execution stages of a very sophisticated installation and has granted BVPSN exclusive use of the repeater during times of emergency or disaster conditions for operations pertaining thereto. The machine is on the Channel 11 emergency power system.

During the first session of the new net on July 21 there were 57 checkins. This is about 50% more than had ever checked in before.

New By-Laws Scheduled for Adoption

The Board of Directors returned the draft of the proposed By-Laws to the By-Laws Committee for addition of a provision relating to the Registered Agent of the Corporation. Such addition was made and the draft returned to the Board for further consideration.

The Board now has approved the proposed By-Laws and has directed

that a copy be mailed to each member of the Club, along with the Bulletin which will be mailed prior to the September, 1980 regular membership meeting.

The lack of a regular monthly newsletter has been solved by our offering to take over as editor. Now the only problem we have left to solve is to persuade committee chairmen to furnish a committee activity report each month for inclusion in the Bulletin.

The chairmen of three of our committees promised us, upon a special personal solicitation, to give us a written report containing certain information which will be of timely and continuing interest to Club members.
