There were three hidden transmitter operators in all: Barry N5FAB, #1, simply found a comfortable spot to park his car in the Montrose area and then proceeded to confound the hunters by running 200 watts in the comfort of his car! Phil WB5SUR, #2, located a nice place to park in a parking garage in downtown Houston. He said that he had a lot of fun annoying the hunters. Phil not only ran 200 watts but also used a pair of phased 6-element quads which allowed him to bounce his signal off of the building of his choice. MINUTES OF 10/3/83 MEETING OF MEMORIAL EMERGENCY RADIO ASSOCIATION (MERA)

HOSPITAL STATUS - Tom WB5MXX gave a brief synopsis of the historical relationship between Memorial Hospital, B-VARC, and the WB5RDK repeater. He also explained the needs, intentions, and wishes of the hospital.
A grant from a contributions group is a definite possibility if we can show
that the primary role of the upcoming repeater is to provide emergency communications.

TREASURY - There is about \$600 in the/at the present time and signature cards are being prepared for Ron KA5GYG, Bob N5DQR, and Bob W5UBD. Henry N5HF, Harold ND5F, and Ron KA5GYG are ordering parts to build 60 J-pole 2-meter antennas. They will be built at the shop of Bob N5DQR and sold at the convention next weekend to further finance MERA endeavors. Vic K5KNH is writing instructions and technical data to be provided with each antenna.

BY-LAWS - Stu WB5IGG will assist in preparing by-laws for MERA, using B-VARC By-Laws as a model.

REPEATER - At present we are still using two transceivers located at the home of Mark WB5RDK. A technical committee was formed, consisting of Jim W5RNK, Louis KD5GM, Jon N5BHQ, and Bob N5DQR. Within about 60 days the following will be accomplished:

- A. The borrowed Corsicana machine will have been checked out and modified in the workshop of Ron KA5GYG.
- B. Crystals and duplexers will have been ordered.
- C. An ID board and COR have been donated by Jim W5RNK, a Ringo Ranger II antenna has been donated by Larry N5BYJ, and heliax cable will have been ordered by Mike N5APC.
- D. All of the above will have been integrated and placed in service on top of the Memorial Hospital building.
- E. It is hoped that after about 6 months in this configuration, the Frequency Coordinator will assign us a permanent and different frequency pair. In the meantime, the present .25 machine needs to have activity on it.
