#### NAVY-MARINE CORPS MARS NEEDS HELP

The Navy-Marine Corps Military Affiliate Radio System (Navy MARS) is a program conducted by the Department of the Navy in which licensed U. S. amateur radio stations voluntarily participate and contribute to the mission of providing auxiliary communications on a local, national and international basis as an adjunct to normal naval communications.

I am a member of Navy MARS and, from time to time, we find ourselves woefully short of members in the Fort Bend-Harris-Waller Counties area.

In order to accomplish our mission, the majority of our activities center on training. This consists of training in Naval communications, procedures, traffic handling — more ham 20,000 messages per month by SSB, RTY and CW — checking into established MARS nets and participating in Communications exercises.

Many of the frequencies used to handle this traffic and by the Navy MARS nets are close to the ham bands; many of the ham rigs' ranges will include at least some of these frequencies without modification. Although much of the heavy traffic is passed by RTTY at 100 WPM, a great deal of it is passed on SSB and CW.

#### A SECOND CHANCE IN 30 DAYS!

At this writing, the Convention Planning Committee for the ARRL Texas State Convention to be held here in Houston the first weekend in October, has offered has assured us that Amateur Radio license examinations will be held at the convention and administered under the new Volunteer Examiner Program.

As most of us know, an applicant who fails to pass an examination element at an examination session must wait at least 30 dAys before taking that specific examination again.

Assuming that the convention examinations will be held on Saturday, October 6, the 30th calendar day after that Saturday will be Monday, November 5, the first dayof the scheduled FCC-conducted examinations.

In a telephone conversation with a lady named Wilma, who, we've been told, is the Examiner-in-Charge for the Houston District FCC Office, we were told that she could see no problem in a failee of an examination element on October 6 taking another shot at it during the week of November 5-9.

Although we hope the question will be moot by reason of everyone passing the October 6 exam, if the unexpected should happen and you miss it, submit your Form 610 application for a place on the November 5-9 schedule to the Houston FCC before October 15 (the deadline for entries to the November 5-9 schedule).
