- 5. CHOSE THE TYPE OF FILE TRANSFER (A) FOR ASCII OR (X) FOR X-MODEM
- 6. THEN SET UP YOUR TERMINAL FOR THE FILE TRANSFER ( THIS METHOD WILL VARY FROM COMPUTER TO COMPUTER AND DEPENDING ON YOUR TERMINAL SOFTWARE )
- 7. AFTER THE FILE HAS COMPLETELY TRANSFERED, YOU WILL BE PROMPTED FOR UP TO A 40 CHARACTER DESCRIPTION OF THE FILE..
