MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 5, 1985

Present: ND5F, ND5E, KE5SC, KA5GYG, W5RNK, KD5XX, NZ5I, KA5GTU, KF5CP, KA5RXX Minutes taken by ND5E.

ND5F called the meeting to order at 7:30pm.

NDSF noted that the published minutes of the general membership meeting on July 11, 1985 contained an error. Roger K5NTY, reported on the MS-150 bike tour, not Roger, WA5RNL.

The publication committee report from KASRXX indicated that the bulletin has been typeset and should be produced soon NZ5I initiated discussion of the format of the bulletin, saying he liked last month's format. The discussion indicated that there is no cost savings for one format over the other. ND5F announced that WB5IGG will reimburse the printer for last month's issue (\$ 25.00) and invoice the club later.

The registered agent and registered office of BVARC will be transferred to ND5E. ND5E was directed to learn whether or not donations to the club are tax-deductible, and to what extent. It was decided that ND5E still request copies of missing bank statements from the bank in order that a proper audit be possible. An audit committee will be formed in the November timeframe.

The Cellar Door where our last banquet was held has closed, so a new location will need to be found.

KASGTU reported that about 800 raffle tickets were picked up at the last meeting and about 200 more have been picked up since. KASTJS will be compiling a computer log of ticket sales. KASGTU will build a barrel to hold the tickets for the drawing. Discussion about pricing tickets revealed that the TDXS tickets are on sold in books of 20 for 21 dollars. A motion by NZ5I seconded by KASRXX to leave our current prices of 1 ticket for 1 dollar and 12 tickets for 10 dollars unchanged PASSED without opposition. A motion by NZ5I seconded by W5RNK to also allow selling 6 tickets for 5 dollars PASSED without opposition. It was reiterated that the winner need not be present at the drawing, nor need be a licensed amateur. It was also reiterated that a prize of 50 dollars will be awarded to the person selling the most tickets for the raffle.

KF5CP reported that the two large signs are ready, one for the flea mart, one for the main lobby. These signs are 22 inch by 44 inch. There will also be three "Ham-Com Parking" signs for the parking area. These are smaller pedestal signs. NZ5I is in charge of the parking effort. KE5SC reported that he had talked to Jim Rogers about parking and the transmitter hunt, but no discussion had been made about a table for the lobby.

KF5CP reported on programs for the next meetings. September will be WD5GAZ demonstrating packet radio. October will be Ray Wangler, ARRL West Gulf Division Director, although complete confirmation of this is not yet in hand.

NDSF reported that our volunteer examination program has been very sucessful so far. He has a report in this month's bulletin. Also, volunteers for examination session liaison are needed for next year.

KESSC reported that at this time no Novice classes are planned.

NZ5I reported that no activities have been reported to him. He will remind the club of our awards. He also reminded us of the informal CW gathering on 14.130 at 9:30 PM Tuesdays and Thursdays.

NZ5I also offered to provide contest and propagation information for the Bulletin to raise interest in contesting and DXing within the club. KF5CP suggested that the club participate in contests as a group, similar to the field day operation.

KA5GYG reported that he found two other past presidents for the nominating committee. Jerry Albright is moving away from the area.

W5RNK is assembling another repeater to replace the MERA machine.

ND5F reported that N5AER is moving, and has offered a tower and beam to the club. Discussion ensued about the difficulties of transporting and storing these. Also noted was that the club has no permanent location for storing or using club property. A mini-warehouse was suggested as a possiblity, but no price information was known.

ND5F adjourned the meeting at 9:40 PM.

My head is still pounding, concentration nill, and my ego a little bit dampened. I participated in the National Contest Journal Sprints the last two weekends. September 8th being the CW event and

# CONTESTS (cont.)

September 15th being the Phone event. Whew! Let me tell you these are incredibly difficult contests to score high in. Not to mention winning!

In this particular contest, the entire event lasts only 4 hrs. You must try to work as many stations as humanly possible, once for each of the 20, 40, and 80 meter bands. The exchange is your call, his call, serial number of the QSO, your name, and your state. (wonder why they dont require our underwear size!) If you are the CQing station, you must forfeit the frequency to the station whom you just made contact with, and vice versa. You must move at least 5 KCs away from that frequency. If you are just answering CQ calls, then you must move at least 1 KC away after each QSO. The multipliers are each state or country in North America. Multipliers can only count once. But you may work the same fellow once on each band.

Sound easy? Well it isn't! Oh, by the way the record, I am told, is 374 in the CW event. Thats 1 about QSO every 40 seconds! I dont even know what the record is for the phone event.

Contests are excellent for picking up your CW speed. The CW events are generally at about 30-40 wpm. This may sound fast, but you know what the exchange is going to be and you pretty much have no trouble copying 5 - 10 wpm faster than your capable of. My CW proficiency has picked up amazingly well because of the contests I have entered. Another big benefit of contesting is the paper collecting by way of foriegn QSLs. Many different ops overseas operate only for contests and therefore this is the only means you may have to pick up a rare one. If you work a popular worldwide contest such as CQ-WPX, and use your call sign the entire contest, you'll be amazed at how many DX QSL cards appear in your mail box.

Contests may not be your bag, but you never know if you don't try! If you don't like CW then enter the phone event and see how you do. If you wish just hop in there and throw your call around a few times to get the feel of it. For you guys who think your good....the NCJ SPRINT tells no lies! I'm thinking about publishing more on the subject of contests in the bulletin if you like the idea tell me so. If you need help tell me that too.
