FCC TAKING LONGER TO ISSUE LICENSES from W5YI report 2/1/86

The length of time that it takes Amateur radio operator licenses to be issued continues to increase. It is taking a week longer than last month. Allow a minimum of two months before contacting your VEC or the FCC about a delinquent license. We also find that in the majority of cases, errors on the FCC Form 610 are the major reason for excessive processing times.

Allow 3 to 4 months for the paper work to catch up if you have upgraded twice. Both the ARRL and W5YI-VEC programs write the applicant to submit a previous upgrade license when received before forwarding the most recent upgrade application. The application then goes in a "hold file". We handle all applications within 24 hours of receipt!

It is not at all unusual for us to hold a new upgrade application two months before the applicant sends us a previous upgrade license so that we can attach it to the new application. If there is an error on the application, the problem is compounded. We have dozens of applications (going back to December testing) awaiting licenses to be attached to them and forwarding to Gettysburg!

And Gettysburg doesn't issue the second upgrade immediately. It must go through the "process" again - including being compared to the Washington, DC, licensee data base some 100 miles away. The data (on magnetic tape) is sent by courier to Washington. The licenses are output after courier return. It all takes time - and with more testing activity now that the amateur community is handling the program - more time is required. Tell your applicants to be patient. VECs and the FCC can't process your newer applications if they are bogged down checking on the previous ones that they are trying to handle as fast as they can. Fewer than one inquiry in a hundred is really the result of a problem or mishandling - the rest merely cause further delays.

Be aware that the FCC does NOT log in applications. If you contact the FCC and they tell you they "have no record" of your application, they mean it has not yet been "key stroked" - entered into the system. Since this is one of the

last things they do, "no record" does not mean they don't have your 610. It merely means they do not know if they have it or not. It is prohibitively time consuming for the FCC to do a desk-by-desk search for an application. Every applicant is issued a Certificate of Successful Completion when upgrading that carries temporary upgrade operating privileges for a year.

But that doesn't mean that the FCC doesn't make errors. They do... but darn few compared to applicants, VEs... and yes VECs too. We have several applicants that upgraded and received the same license that they previously had. A "key stroke" error was made when the application was input into FCC terminals in Gettysburg. It is being straightened out.
