This is the first of what we hope will be a continuing series of articles for the B-VARC Newsletter. By. these articles, we hope to keep you informed of out progress as the emergency management arm of the Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club.

In the past several months, under the guidance of Ron, KA5GYG and Ed, W5WVX, we have made great strides in becoming a viable communications arm for Ft. Bend County in the event of an emergency. Our training, on the air and in class, has been both thorough and realistic. Those of you who have not participated with us in the past, we invite you to do so in the future.

We have a voice net on 145.25 every Monday evening at 8:00. In addition, as time allows, we have a packet net on 145.07 just after the voice net but we do not let it interfere with the B-VARC net at 9:00. Please join us on both nets if your equipment capabilities allow.

Recognizing that packet radio is and will continue to be, a major mode of communication in emergency situations as well as public service events, we plan to spend more training hours on that mode in the future. In addition to our own packet net, we invite all packeteers to join the area packet net on Sunday night at 9:00 on 146.70. This is a training net at this time and does not involve format traffic as such. This is an excellent net for practice in file transfer, text editing, etc., to help you become more familiar with the capabilities of your computer, TNC and terminal program.

- 2. Remove the battery pack.
- 3. Remove the front & back panels.
- 4. Locate RX unit X55-1380-10.
- 5. Remove diode #32 and #33.
- 6. Reassemble and press reset.

Minutes, Board of Directors Meeting, February 7, 1987 recorded by George W. Jolly, ND5E

Attending the meeting were: ND5E KA5DUU N5APW W5RNK N5FNA N5JKD Attending by proxy were: N5GZW

- 1) Call to order at 10 AM by ND5E
- 2) N5APW proposed moving our checking acount from Texas American Bank to San Jacinto Savings. The reason was to get a lower minimum balance for avoiding service charges. Our current account is now charging us because our balance has fallen below \$1,000.00. W5RNK made a MOTION to move our account to San Jacinto savings. N5FNA seconded. The MOTION was unanimously PASSED.
- 3) N5APW agreed to take over the duty of checking our Missouri City post office box for mail periodically.
- 4) N5APW agreed to contact WN5A and arrange for the publication of a club roster. He explained that since our Bulletin is lathis month the roster may be prepared in time to mail with it
- 5) ND5E gave a report about ongoing efforts to provide a Novice class at an Alief school, potentially in conjunction with the Civil Air Patrol. W5RNK explained that he had, in the past, discussions.
- 6) KA5DUU described a 1-watt full break-in CW transmitter he has built and is making good contacts with. Discussion led t the general intent to develop this transmitter and a companio receiver and publish the plans in the Bulletin. The desire i to provide a low-cost participation for school-age people who usually could not afford store-bought gear. W5RNK offered to work on the receiver design.
- 7) N5FNA made a MOTION that, providing WN5A is willing to serve again, that we certify WN5A and N5APW as our audit committee. The motion was seconded by W5RNK and was unanimously PASSED. This audit will cover the period from November 1, 1985 through December 31, 1986.
- 8) The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 AM, after which ND5E, KA5DUU, and N5APW (accompanied by KA5SGM) went to San Jacinto Savings and opened our new checking account.

B-VARC ORDER OF THE KEY

Although in November of each year is the time for Club members to nominate candidates for the Order of the Key award, the beginning of the year is the time for all members to be aware of what it takes to be eligible to receive this symbol of the Club's appreciation for a job well done. Candidates should be only those who have made significant personal contributions during the year or over an extended period of time.

This prestigious award is made only to B-VARC members by the Club's general membership and who receive unanimous approval by the Board of Directors. This distinction can be earned only by voluntary service for the advancement of Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club.

The following standards are diligently applied to all prospective recipients as the means of preserving the meaning and importance of this very special award:

1.) The extra special effort or extraordinary performance by a member after volunteering for a particular task or project. Such a significant service to the Club could take place over a relatively short period and represent loyalty or effort that is normally "beyond the call of duty".

2.) The performance of dedicated and outstanding service to B-VARC over an extended of time.

Nomination of a Club member to be a candidate for the Order of the Key award must be in writing, addressed to the Board of Directors, and be in the hands of any member of the Board not later than one week prior to the December meeting of the Board. The nomination should state the reasons why the nominee has earned the award. Awards, if any, will be presented at the January banquet meeting of the Club.

This award is unique to B-VARC. It was conceived by a Club member and was first presented in 1980 to Bob Spradling W5UBD.

The Club Membership Roster includes the impressive list of recipients of the B-VARC Order of the Key award. Hopefully, it will inspire you to join the ranks of those who have done the most to make the Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club what it is today.

B-VARC'S NEW NOVICE CLASS
