Dave, AA5GA, asked me to develop the election proposals which were first described in the December, 1987 issue of the Bulletin. The attached paper is the result of effort over about a week by myself, Robert N5JKD, and Larry KB5AKS. This is obviously a rather lengthy proposal, but in general you should find it to be easily readable and clear.

It is now your turn to get involved. Study the proposal carefully and discuss its pros and cons. If there are any holes or deficiencies we should find and correct them now, before formal publication in the Bulletin. If you utterly hate the idea, lobby against it.

If we are to make these changes this year, they really should be ratified at the August membership meeting. That way the election process can begin immediately after ratification. This will mean formal publication of this proposal in the August Bulletin, so we have some time to discuss it informally and make any necessary adjustments before 'official' publication.

I will be available for any questions. Feel free to discuss this with Club members, but try to avoid misunder-standings about the voting on this proposal - it will occur under the old rules at a membership meeting, hopefully in August.

Proposed By-Laws Amendments: Voting Procedures

George W. Jolly, ND5E, June, 1988

PURPOSE OF PROPOSAL

- 1) Improve access to Club business for members living over a wide geographical area, including, if applicable, life members.
- 2) Professionalize the election process.
- Improve the Club's responsiveness to changing times.
- Adjust outdated parts of the By-Laws to account for current practice.

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION

This proposed amendment provides for membership voting and general elections to be held by mail ballot.

It adds two new Articles to define these procedures, and makes technical adjustments to other areas of the By-Laws which reference voting or election procedures, or are directly influenced by these changes.

Normal membership voting is strongly encouraged, but not absolutely required, to be handled by mail. We don't do much of this, anyway, since we don't like business as much as Ham Radio.

Officer and Director elections are required to be handled by mail.

In this method of mail voting, all votes must be returned by mail. It will not be possible to bring the ballot to a meeting. Ample time is allowed for discussion between members before the ballot deadline.

The nominating committee is renamed the Election Committee, and is responsible for the management of all mail votes, whether for an election or other purpose.

The role of the Election Committee in the nomination of election candidates is altered. It will now compile the complete list of candidates, and publish the ballot, but will not recommend any particular candidate.

Membership in the Election Committee has been redefined. Only the chairman must come from the ranks of past presidents. The other two members are appointed by the Board of Directors from among the general Club membership.

Exclusion of a candidate from the ballot is explicitly limited to a list of legitimate causes (ineligibility to hold office, refusal to run).

Membership vote by proxy is prohibited, whether by mail or in person.

Board of Director proxies are defined to account for current practice.

TEXT OF PROPOSED CHANGES

= = = = Replace Article II Section B as follows:

Officers shall be elected for a term of one (1) year. The term will commence on January 1 of the year following the election. Ceremonial installation of the new officers may be held at a January banquet if desired.

= = = = Replace Article II Section C as follows:

Nomination and election of officers shall be in accordance with Article XI.

= = = = Replace Article II Section E as follows:

The membership of the Club reserves the right to remove any officer from office.

- 1) A mail vote according to Article X to remove any officer from office may be initiated by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present at a membership meeting. Such mail ballots shall be distributed by special mailing, not included in the Club newsletter, and shall be mailed to the membership within two (2) weeks of the membership meeting at which the balloting was initiated.
- 2) Should the mail ballots not be distributed as required herein, the officer may be be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members at a subsequent membership meeting.

= = = = Replace Article IV Section A as follows:

The Board of Directors shall consist of all Officers of the Club, the Activities Chairman, if any, three (3) at large members, and the Past President Director.

At large Director positions shall each carry a term of three (3) years. The terms shall be offset one year apart such that each year one at large Director position shall expire and stand for election. The Past President Director shall be the immediate past president of the Club, and shall serve during the contiguously following term(s) of his/her immediate successor to the presidency. Thus the Past President Director will usually serve for one year, unless his/her successor be re-elected consecutively as president.

- = = = = Replace Article IV Section B as Follows:
- 1. Vacancies of at large members of the Board of Directors shall be filled by appointees of the Board for the unexpired terms.
- 2. Should the Past President Director resign from the Board, the position shall be filled from the previous past presidents of the Club, searching in reverse chronological order for the most recent past president who is available and willing to serve. If none are found, the position will not be filled until the election of a new president fills it naturally.
- = = = = Replace Article V Section A as follows:

No action binding the Club shall be taken at any membership meeting unless a quorum of members is present.

- 1. A quorum shall consist of twenty-five (25) percent of the Club's total membership.
- 2. Unless urgency forbids, formal votes on issues which concern a large segment of the club membership shall be decided by mail in accordance with Article X, or by the Board of Directors, instead of at a regular membership meeting.
- Proxy votes shall not be accepted for any membership vote.
- = = = Replace Article V Section E as follows:

Election of Officers and at large Directors shall be accomplished in accordance with Article XI.

= = = Replace Article V Section F as follows:

Written notice of membership meetings is required.

- 1) The Corresponding Secretary shall notify members of the Club of each membership meeting by written notice to be mailed at least seven (7) calender days prior to the date of the meeting, but no earlier than ninety (90) days prior.
- 2) The Club newsletter shall contain a schedule of club meetings. This schedule will satisfy the requirements of paragraph one if the time constraints therein are met.

- = = = Amend Article V Section G to add paragraphs 3, 4, 5 and 6 as follows
- 3) The Board of Directors shall conduct at least one (1) regularly scheduled monthly Board Meeting, notice of which shall be included in the Club newsletter meeting schedule to allow attendance by the general membership.
- 4) Any club member may attend any meeting of the Board of Directors to provide informal input. Except for the provisions of paragraph three, the Board is not required to give formal notice of Board meetings to the general membership.
- 5) Members of the Board of Directors may assign their right to vote in any Board of Directors vote to any member of the Club. The member granting such proxymust notify at least one (1) member of the Board other than the person to whom the proxy is assigned.
- 6) Determination of a quorum for a Board of Directors meeting shall include not more than three proxies.
- = = = Replace Article VII Section F as follows:

The expenditure of Club funds shall be authorized by a majority vote of the Board of Directors, or by a valid membership vote as defined in these By-Laws.

= = = Replace Article IX completely as follows:

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS

Article IX Section A

The By-Laws may be amended by a mail membership vote in accordance with Article X. A two-thirds affirmative vote shall be required for passage.

Article IX Section B

Proposals for amendments to the By-Laws shall be submitted in writing to the President of the Club and to the Election Chairman.

Article IX Section C

The Election Chairman shall prepare a mail ballot naming each issue to be decided and submit it to the membership in accordance with Article X. Such ballot shall be accompanied by the complete text of each proposal.

Article IX Section D

A mail vote for By-Laws amendment may be declared invalid by a vote of the Board of Directors if fewer than fifteen (15) valid ballots are returned. This issue must be raised according to the challenge requirements of Article X.

= = = = ADD ARTICLES X and XI as follows:

ARTICLE X - MAIL VOTING PROCEDURES

Article X Section A

An issue requiring a vote by the membership of the club may be taken by mail ballot.

Article X Section B

Provisions concerning the management of the mail voting process shall be:

- The process of all mail voting shall be managed by the Election Committee through its chairman.
 Membership of the Election Committee is defined in Article XI.
- 2. Receipt, validation, counting, storage, and eventual destruction of returned mail ballots shall be the responsibility of the Election Committee chairman.
- 3. It is recommended, but not required, that the other members of the Election Committee double-check the counting of the votes.
- 4. The Election Committee shall preserve the confidentiality of the ballots received, disclosing only the final vote tally to the membership.
- a. A mail vote may be challenged by the Chairman of the Board of Directors within thirty (30) days of the deadline date. Any such challenge shall be resolved by the Election Committee and the Board of Directors. The Election Committee shall provide all ballots, including those declared invalid, to the Board of Directors upon request.
- b. In the absence of such challenge, or in the case of its satisfactory resolution, all ballots shall be destroyed thirty (30) days after the deadline date.

Article X Section C

Provisions concerning the distribution of ballots to members shall be:

- 1. A mail ballot shall be distributed by US Mail (or in person) to all members for whom the Club has a valid USA address at the time the mailing is prepared.
- a. It is the intent of this Article that the Club newsletter be the usual vehicle for the distribution of mail ballots to the membership. The Board of Directors may direct a special mailing of ballots when required.
- b. The existence of a ballot must be clearly announced on the address side of the outside of the mailing, in type no smaller than 20 point.

- c. If the ballot is for By-Laws amendment, or for Officer or Director elections, this fact must be stated in the announcement on the outside of the mailing.
- 2. Each ballot shall specify the deadline date for return to Club.
- a) The deadline date for return shall be the date of receipt at the specified address, not the postmark date on the returned ballot.
- b) The deadline date shall be not less than 20 days later than the date of original mailing to the membership.
- Each ballot shall specify the address for return to Club.
- a) The address for return of completed ballots shall be either the Club's official post office box, or the personal mailing address of the Election Chairman, at the discretion of the Election Chairman.
- b) The Board of Directors may, at its discretion, direct the Election Chairman to use the Club's official post office box instead of the Election Chairman's personal mailing address.
- 4. A single mailing to the membership shall contain at most one ballot which must contain all questions to be voted. This is to avoid overlooking a second ballot, and shall not prohibit including duplicate copies for family members.
- 5. Family members may either vote on a duplicate ballot, or the ballot may be constructed with space for family members to vote.
- 6. Not more than one (1) mailing containing a ballot shall be mailed to the membership in any single calendar month. This is determined by the month of mailing, not the month of receipt by a member, and is intended to avoid deluging the membership with ballots.

Article X Section D

The Election Chairman shall declare a ballot invalid if it fails to pass the following tests:

- 1) The return mailing must be delivered unopened to the Election Chairman. Procedures ensuring this shall be:
- a. The ballot must be returned by the voter to the correct address as specified on the ballot.
- b. If the specified address is not the Election Chairman's personal address, the envelope must be clearly labeled 'BALLOT' on the outside.

- The ballot must be received at the specified address by the deadline date.
- 3) The voter must be eligible to vote as defined in Article I. Provisions ensuring this shall be:
- a. The ballot must legibly contain the name and callsign, if any, of the member voting on the ballot.
- b. The ballot must be signed by either the voter, or a witness if the voter is unable to sign.

Article X Section E

Except where specified otherwise in these By-Laws, the quorum for a mail vote shall be those valid ballots received.

Article X Section F

Required percentages for passage of a vote shall be considered as a percentage of those valid ballots received. Except where specified otherwise in these ByLaws, a vote shall require a simple majority for decision.

ARTICLE XI - OFFICER AND DIRECTOR ANNUAL ELECTIONS

Article XI Section A

There shall be a standing Election Committee. Provisions defining membership of the Election Committee shall be:

- 1. The Election Committee shall consist of a chairman and two members.
- a. The chairman of the Election Committee shall be the most recent available past president of the Club. If no past presidents are available and willing to serve, the Board of Directors shall appoint a chairman from among the Club membership.
- b. The members of the Election Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors from among the general membership.
- 2. If any member, or the chairman, of the Election Committee elects to run for a Club office or directorship, he/she shall resign from the Election Committee for the remainder of that calendar year.

Article XI Section B

All elections of Officers and Directors shall be conducted by mail ballot in accordance with Article X.

Article XI Section C

Provisions concerning the nomination process shall be-

- 1. The Election Committee shall actively solicit nominations from the membership of the Club for each office and compile them into a ballot for mail voting.
- 2. It shall be the responsibility of the Election Committee to ensure, through its powers of persuasion, that each office to be elected shall be represented by at least one nominee.
- 3. A candidate may be self nominated.
- 4. The nomination process shall begin at the start of August.
- 5. All nominations must be received by the Election Committee chairman by midnight of the fourth Thursday in September, at which point nominations will be declared closed.
- 6. Any candidate may submit a written statement to the Election Committee chairman prior to the close of nominations for publication with the ballot. The statement must be not longer than 250 words and must not contain indecent language. (Compliance will be determined by the chairman of the Election Committee).
- 7. The Election Committee is free to publish in any manner intermediate lists of candidates at any time to assist in the soliciation of participation, provided that such lists meet all other requirements for inclusion of candidates. A candidate published on such list may, without prejudice, withdraw or choose to run for a different office up until the close of nominations.

Article XI Section D

Provisions applicable to construction of the slate of candidates by the Election Committee shall be:

- 1. The Election Committee shall not officially recommend any particular candidate for any office.
- 2. The Election Committee shall not exclude any nominated candidate from the ballot except as provided in these By-Laws.
- 3. The Election Committee shall exclude from the ballot any nominated candidate who is not a current member of the Club in good standing as defined in these By-Laws.

- 4. The Election Committee shall exclude from the ballot any nominated candidate who is not currently eligible to hold the office for which nominated as defined in these By-Laws. The only exception is that a candidate holding a license upgrade certificate shall be allowed to run if that upgrade will make the candidate eligible when the new license arrives. In the event that such candidate win office, and the upgrade fail to materialize by the start of the term of office, said candidate shall be deemed to have resigned the office at the start of its term.
- 5. The Election Committee shall obtain approval from each candidate before inclusion on the ballot. Any person nominated may decline to run, in which case said person will not be included on the ballot.
- 6. Any candidate nominated for more than one office must choose one office to stand for on the ballot.
- 7. In accordance with Article III Section F, the Election Committee will work with the nominated candidates to find the best fit between the slate and the offices of Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer.
- 8. The ballot shall allow the voter to write in one name for each office instead of voting for the listed candidates. Such write-in candidates must meet the qualifications for office specified in these By-Laws in the same manner as if they had been formally nominated, including acceptance of license upgrade certificates, as of the deadline date.

Article XI Section E

The Election Committee chairman shall be responsible for mailing the ballot to the membership prior to the first Thursday in October in accordance with Article X. It is recommended, but not required, that this mailing be included in the October issue of the Club newsletter.

Article XI Section F

The deadline date for receipt of returned Election Ballots shall be the first Thursday in November.

Article XI Section G

The candidate with the largest number of received votes for a given position shall be declared the winner. In the case of a tie vote, the tie will be broken by a runoff election held at the first November regular membership meeting after the deadline date. Members should be aware that it will not be possible to include notice of this fact in the November newsletter.

Article XI Section H

The Election Committee chairman shall be responsible for reporting the results of the election at the November regular membership meeting(s). If schedule permits, they will be published in the November newsletter as well.

PART 97 REWRITE WORTH A CAREFUL LOOK

In the four weeks since its release, the FCC-Part 97 rewrite proposal, PR Docket 88-139, has been given careful study by League members, officers, directors, and staff. Quite a list of potential problems, both typographical and substantive, already has been accumulated, and more are bound to be noticed as the document is given further scrutiny.

The ARRL Executive Committee will be discussing the proposed rewrite at its meeting on May 14. A formal League position on the docket probably will not be adopted until the full Board of Directors meets July 21-22.—

The FCC NPRM is too long to be reproduced here, or in QST, in its entirety. June QST contains an article which includes the table of contents for the proposed new Part 97; this at least gives you an idea of how the rewrite is organized.

If you have any special concerns regarding the FCC rules, or if you simply want to be well informed on a matter of great importance to Amateur Radio, you should obtain your own copy of the NPRM. A large self-addressed envelope with 85-cents postage, sent to ARRL HQ and marked "Docket 88-139," will speed a copy back to you.

Driving directions: Take 1-45 to West Road exit; turn left if coming from town.

Go 1.7 miles west to Airline Road; turn right. Go 0.7 miles north to Frick Road; turn left. Go 1.3 miles west to Ann Louise Road; turn left.

Go 0.5 miles west to Ann Louise Road; turn left.

Go 0.4 miles east to gate; follow road northeast to house.
