### HURRICANE SEASON IS APPROACHING by Al Mattis NSAFV

The 1990 hurricane season begins June 1st, and we are hearing a great deal about last year's Hurricane Hugo. Many amateur radio operators provided assitance to their communities during Hugo, but there were others who did not. It wasn't that these operators didn't want to help. They even volunteered on local nets to assist if needed. But many of these volunteers found their offers of assitance declined.

The problem was that these amateur operators were not affiliated with their local ARES or RACES groups. The ARES and RACES groups participate in nets and training drills year round. When an emergency situation develops, these emergency groups are ready to respond with a trained group of volunteers. It is too late to train new members when a hurricane enters the Gulf. For that reason, offers of assistance from many radio operators not affiliated with ARES or RACES were declined.

Many of these radio amateurs felt anger or disappointment when their offers of assistance were declined. I can understand their feelings from personal experience. I once volunteered to assist after a flood struck Tulsa, Oklahoma, in 1978. I had only been licensed for a few months, and because I had not been active in the local RACES group, my offer was declined. I joined the local RACES group the next month.

I encourage any members of B-VARC who are not active in ARES or RACES to become affiliated with these groups. The next time our community is facing a disaster, don't feel like you are on the outside looking in. Both Fort Bend and Harris Counties have active ARES/RACES programs, and many B-VARC members participate in them. Now is the time to become involved in these groups.

### The May Meeting

Once upon a time there was a man that wanted to be a "Ham". He studied and ditted and dahed until such time as his proficiency at various levels satisfied Uncle Harold and his group of nit picking, hard nosed, unswayable, unflappable, ghoulish examiners.

### HAM ON SPACE SHUTTLE MAY 9TH

Spaceship Columbia is scheduled for lift-off on May 9th with astronaut ham Ron Parice, WA4SIR on board with two-meter amateur radio equipment.

Ron will be operating two-meter FM phone and packet radio from the spacecraft throughout the ten-day mission of STS-35, meeting schedules and making prearranged contacts with schools around the country.

The "Newsline Report" tells us to listen for Ron operating from the spacecraft for about an hour during his rest periods on 145.55 MHZ. phone in both the mornings and evenings. Match for his packet station operating on the downlink frequency of 145.55 MHZ. on a 12 hour schedule during the evenings. He will be listening for packet on the uplink frequencies of 144.91, 144.95 or 144.97 only.

The audio from the spacecraft will be broadcast extensively during this mission and should be available to everyone to hear on one of the following frequencies:

MASNAN - Goddard Spacecraft Center 3.860, 7.185, 14.295, 21.395, 28.650 MHZ.

M5RRR - Johnson Spacecraft Center

3.850, 7.227, 14.280, 21 350, 28.400, 146.400 MHZ.

WIAW ~ ARRL Newington, CT.

3.990, 7.290, 14.290, 18.160, 21.390, 28.590 MHZ.

### <u>OTHERS</u>

443.500 (WJ5B - Houston) 171.150 (JSC - Houston)

WASNAM generally transmits the audio on these HF frequencies whenever any shuttle flight is operating. With Ron, WA4SIR on board, MIAW and WSRRR will also be carrying the audio of this flight on HF.

MSRRR will also be operating as a Special Events Station so you will want to make a special effort to work them and send for one of their QSL cards.

For those having computers and tracking programs, WAJNAN plans to update the keplerian elements for the flight every hour to assist you in tracking the progress of the space craft so you can schedule the best times to listen.

The article to the right was sent in by Lee KB5EST. It is a copy from the TEXAS TRAFFIC LAWS, REGISTRATION OF VEHICLES handbook, of the New law concerning Amateur Radio License Plates in Texas. Lee notes that every car you own with radio equipment installed can have the same license plate number (ie. your call sign). He also notes a disadvantage if you car is stolen. You must be able to relay your VIN to the authorities, not just your license plate number. You may get stopped in your other vehicle with the same plate and have to show your VIN to prove the one your in is not the stale, one.

V.C.S. Art. 6701c-2. Special incersor tags for operators of mobil amateur radio equipment. Section 1. Residents of the State of Texas whold an unrevoked and unexpired critical amateur radio station licens issued by the Federal Communications Commission and who operat receiving and transmitting mobile amateur radio equipment in passengears or in trucks, commonly known as pickup trucks, with a manufacturer rated carrying capacity not to exceed 2,000 pounds, upon application, a companied by proof of ownership of such amateur license, complying with the State motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motovehicles, and upon payment of the regular license fee for tags and the pament of an additional fee of Two (\$2) Dollars for the first year of such registration and One (\$1) Dollar for each annual registration thereafte shall be Issued license plates, upon which may be inscribed the official amateur call letters of such applicant as assigned by the Federal Communications Commission.

Sec. 2. Applicants shall furnish proof of the Federal Communication Commission authority and their call letters to the State Highway Department, on or before the 1st day of October, preceding each registration year and the State Highway Department shall furnish their respective Talessessors and Collectors license plates bearing the call letters of the applicant.

Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of the County Tax Assessors and Collecto to keep on file a copy or copies of the license receipts issued for such calletter license plates. At the regular registration period the Tax Collect shall give the applicant the call letter tags and corresponding receipt Such call letter license tags shall be the legal registration insignia for the registration year for which issued, on the vehicle containing the mobil amateur radio equipment, while applicant is the bona fide owner of salvehicle.

Sec. 4. If during the registration year the applicant shall sell, trade, give or in any way dispose of the vehicle upon which the call letter license take are affixed he shall turn such tags into the County Tax Assessor and Collector and receive from him replacement license tags for a fee as prescried by law.

Sec. 5. An owner may register under this Act more than one vehic equipped with mobile amateur radio equipment. The State Department Highways and Public Transportation shall issue license plates inscribe with the same official amateur call letters to each vehicle registered und this Act by the same owner.
