

• Economic Summit Special Events Station by Bill Dessens N5KXU

There has been a lot of discussion about the special events station, both within B-VARC and between and within other ham radio clubs within the Greater Houston area. Because of these discussions, and rumors, I feel that I should set the record straight.

B-VARC initially decided to look into hosting a special events station at the suggestion of Steve, N5PRC, to me, back in March of this year. I thought it was an excellent idea, and quickly communicated the idea to several other people who shared Steve's and my enthusiasm. We soon learned that Al, KK5W, at the M D Anderson club station had the same idea, and it was suggested that we combine forces and invite hams from all the surrounding clubs to participate. It was suggested that a good site would be the hospital because of their willingness to fund our efforts, and there would be no parking problem or expense to operators, in that all our covered parking tickets would be validated. Also, this club has an operating station with excellent facilities (antennas, radios, etc.) whereas most clubs do not. Together, Al, Tom, K5CNU, Elton, NO5C and I began by writing a letter to 32 Houston Area clubs with our plans and invited all clubs to work together, with no one club or set of individuals to stand out from the rest. This was to be an effort of and by the Houston Area ham community. We also decided to try to have a special call, W90ES, approved by the FCC. Of course, we met with very positive results and enthusiasm from area clubs, and began having meetings, formed several committees, started a net, and went to work.

We arranged a breakfast meeting with Mr. Peter Roussel who is Communications Director for the Summit Host Committee, and who is also a ham, K5JCC. He promised to help all he could. We then found out that Mr. Roussel subsequently had a meeting with an "Executive Committee" of the Echo Society, and they decided to have their own special events station. Their president came to one of ou Saturday morning meetings and, in effect, tried to persuade those present to assist Echo in their efforts, and to establish the primary station at the Kirby Mansion located at 2000 Smith Street. He indicated that parking there would be no problem in that they could obtain reserved parking for "about 2 vehicles." Knowing the traffic problems that are likely to be inherent with the enormity of an occasion such as this, we feel that this parking arrangement is woefully inadequate. At any rate, the gentleman from Echo met with considerable resistance, to say the least, from those present at that meeting, and from discussions in subsequent meetings. The general consensus is that, after all the hard work and progress that we had shown, their perceived effort to "take over" was much resented, even by other members of the Echo Society.

We still do not have a favorable response to our request for the special call, but if we don't get it, we will simply use another call. At any rate, we are definitely proceeding with our original plans, and everything will be accelerated and formed up with the next 3 or 4 weeks. We will keep you informed on the nets and at meetings.
