B-VARC Helps ARRL's VE Program

The ARRL has reported another great year in their worldwide Amateur Examination Program for 1989.

The May, 1990 issue of the *VE Express*, the ARRL's Volunteer Examiner newsletter, reported that over two thousand exam sessions were sponsored by the ARRL during 1989.

According to the newsletter, the ARRL's volunteer examiners administered 46,197 exams to a total of 27,287 candidates in 2,231 examination sessions in 1989. Of those attending, 13,932 upgraded their licenses. In addition to these, 1,100 Novice examinations were administered.

These results show that the ARRL sponsors an average of over 6 test sessions each day, providing test materials to over 12 candidates at each of these sessions. The ARRL should be commended for maintaining the efficient organization to certify its Volunteer Examiners and process the results of these tremendous quantities of materials each day.

The January, 1990 issue of the *B-VARC Bulletin* reported that B-VARC sponsored 13 exam sessions in 1989, and that **your** VE Teams administered 581

examinations to 275 candidates. We averaged over 21 candidates at each test session.

A close look at these statistics will show the B-VARC's contribution to this overall effort is significant. Our local exam program represents approximately one percent of the ARRL's entire worldwide efforts.

This major contribution to the ARRL's Volunteer Exam Program could not have been possible without the active participation of B-VARC and its membership. Our success is due to the dedication of our many members who regularly volunteer their evenings to serve as Examiners or Assistants at our monthly sessions.

Again, my special thanks to Stu, WB5IGG, who spends many hours every month serving as B-VARC's public contact and to Strake Jesuit for providing the excellent meeting room for our Tuesday evening examinations.
