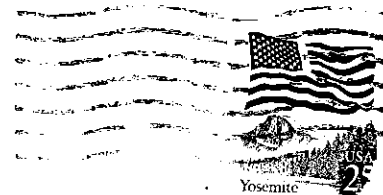
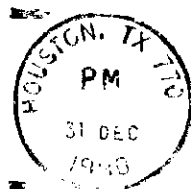

Observations on *The Country Store*

Recently an article was published in a local newspaper about the old fashioned Country Store. The reporter had gone to a place he had visited some years ago to find that the old store was no longer there. Like many of us, I remember this institution of the past with fondness. When I was a child my grandfather ran one on a dirt road in East Texas. It had a potbelly stove in the center of the room around which locals gathered in the winter to keep themselves warm and to warm the air with their conversations. Everything was open for discussion. They would solve all of the world's problems every hour or so. Times were hard then and most were farmers. They talked about their crop and the price it might bring. They talked politics because they were mostly of one mind, and it seldom produced an

argument that was serious. They teased each other in a gentle way that was more an expression of friendship than an attempt to hurt. Their lives were hard, filled with back-breaking labor for little reward, but they shared something around the old stove that few people have today. They shared their lives; the good and the bad, and by doing so they had something very special and rare. The amazing thing is that there were no scheduled meetings, no one held office, no dues were paid, and there were no formal rules.

Today the Old Country Store is hard to find. The children and grandchildren of these people have moved to the city for the most part. Everything in their lives is regulated, licensed, taxed or has a set of administrative rules. There are organizations which provide friendship and support such as clubs, charitable groups, lodges and churches. These organizations are important, useful and essential to life in the modern world, but where is the freedom to warm yourself by the rusty old stove with a group of friends? To speak if you wish or just listen. To share with others a feeling of having something in common.

Well, I have found such a place. It was right under my nose, but it was very hard to recognize. The old store filled with the basic essentials of life is now a small room filled with electronic gear. The ladder-back cane bottom chair is now a high-back office chair. The old potbelly stove has been replaced with the glow and warmth of amplifier tubes. The cracker barrel, the pickle barrel, and the candy case have been replaced by canned drinks and bags of chips. Everything has changed, and yet it is the same. Late at night, I can hear men discussing politics and solving all of the world's problems every hour or so. They talk if they wish or just listen. There is a large audience who listen every night and say nothing at all, just as I did as a child in my grandfather's store. They talk of their good fortune and their bad luck. They share stories about a daughter's wedding or a child born into the family. One has a new car, one sold an old car and bought a new radio. They talk of birth, death and illness. They discuss trips, recreational vehicles, antennas and which way the water turns in a drain. In short, they talk about anything and everything. There are no dues, no rules and everything possible is done to keep it informal. These people are sharing their friendship and their lives. The Old Country Store is still there, it just doesn't look the same.
