NI5I 442.325 Repeater On The Air!

The 442.325 NI5I repeater is up and running. Located atop Memorial Southwest Hospital, this repeater boasts excellent range and a phone patch with speed dial capability. It is intended that both the repeat and the patch remain open for use by any amateurs who have the required privileges and equipment.

To bring up the patch, dial the code 501 and listen for the dial tone. Then dial your number.

To bring the patch down, dial the code #51 which should trigger the message "Phone Patch Clear".

Please do NOT dial 911 on this repeater because the call could result in the police being dispatched to the hospital by mistake. Instead use one of the following emergency speed dial numbers:

- 680 Poison Control Center 681 Houston EMS
- 682 Houston Police Department
- 683 Harris County Sheriff
- 684 Dept of Public Safety Highway Patrol
- 685 Fort Bend County Sheriff
- 686 Fort Bend County EMS
- 687 Fort Bend County EOC

When your call is complete, please be sure to brir, down the patch. Enjoy it, and let's keep this repeater and patch open for all to use! 73's

B-VARC Board of Directors Meeting Action & Comments, February 7th, 1991

Cash on hand in the club treasury is \$2,847.39.

Ralph Cheek, KB5DNT, was elected to fill the oneyear director's position on the Board.

A letter has been mailed to former B-VARC members encouraging them to renew their membership for 1991. Approximately 130 persons have paid dues to date.

Steve Shirk, KB5OLF, was appointed to be Program Chairman for 1991.

Earle Herbert, WB1CCH, and Charley Prochaska, KG5KV, audited the B-VARC books for 1990, and all was in order.

In addition to *The Dr. Bill Award* and *The Order of the Key*, the Board decided to make the *Loop and Zep Award* an official B-VARC award to be given annually.

There was an average of fourteen check-ins to the Rag Chew Net this year, three of which were out-of-state. Thirty-three different stations have checked in so far in 1991.

The 442.345 machine has been installed on Memorial Southwest Hospital. Chuck, NI5I, is trustee, however it falls under the M.E.R.A. umbrella. 911 and 1+ calls are blocked out. A phone patch is available and speed codes for the Police, Sheriff, etc., will be published elsewhere in the *Bulletin* along with operating instructions.

Party 97 of the FCC Rules and Regulations will be thoroughly studied to make sure there are no violations of the rules during the "For Sale" or "Swap" portion of the Public Service Net.

The club is looking into using Bulk Mail and Bar Codes for the B-VARC Bulletin mailout.

A copy of the B-VARC Bulletin will be mailed to all advertisers in the Bulletin.

New name tags are in the process of being made.

The next Novice class will begin March 11, 1991, and will be held on Monday nights at Strake Jesuit. Approximately 95% of those in the Novice class who pass the Novice test also pass the Technician test within 30 days of completing the class.

It is a well known fact that hams like to experiment. Some are successful, most are not. A few of the more successful ones capture the imagination and interest of not only other hams, but the public at large. One of these experiments is the subject of our March membership meeting.

A little better than 3 months ago, the fruits of many peoples' efforts were realized. To say that it was a success would be an understatement.

Andy MacAllister, WA5ZIB, will be the speaker at the March 14th meeting and will also have a composite video tape of several amateur camcorder tapes relative to the launch, flight and eventual shooting down of the instrument package. The Helium Balloon Experiment was launched at Huntsville, Texas, and eventually came down near Beaumont, Texas.

Andy designed and built most of the instrument package that was carried by the balloon. The transmissions from that flight were copied by hams in Texas, Oklahoma, and Louisiana, with some in Arkansas. Another, more elaborate, experiement is being readied for an April launch. It is very sophisticated, and Andy will fill us in on the plans for it as well as tell us about the design, launch, flight and eventual "shoot down" of the one that was conducted in December.

Andy has spoken to B-VARC before (and we are going to make him keep coming back until he gets it right!). Many of you know Andy as a vice-president of the national AMSAT organization. Well, not only has he won international recognition for his pioneering work on satellites but has now "made his mark" on balloon flights.

So, for a first-class program on something new and something that we all can participate in, either directly, or at home by "tuning in", come out to the B-VARC March membership meeting at the Missouri City Fire Station at 7:30 pm on March 14th.

There will be plenty of free parking and coffee.
