

Many area hams participated in tracking and monitoring the balloon.

How many of you met Jim Heil, KB5AWM, at our last membership meeting? Jim is the driving force behind the Houston Amateur Radio Helpline. The B-VARC Board of Directors recently approved club

B-VARC again sponsored and administered the ARRL's Amateur Radio Examinations that were given on two occasions this past month.

Exams were administered to B-VARC's Novice Class on Monday evening, May 6, 1991, at Strake Jesuit College Preparatory in Houston by Jack, WN5A, and Harold, ND5F. Melanie, KB5KLH, assisted with the organization of the testing materials.

A total of thirty-two (32) Novice Element examere offered to seventeen (17) members of the class. Three (3) candidates passed both Element 1A and 2 to receive their new Novice Lincenses. A total of sixteen applicants passed nineteen (19) elements for an overall "pass rate" of fifty-nine (59%) percent.

Many of these candidates who passed Element 2 are looking forward to receiving their new "no-cod" Technician License by passing Element 3A at V.E. Exam Session.

Cash on hand in the club treasury is \$2,711.03.

Three new members have paid their dues. We now have 166 club members.

The World Radio magazine Gift Certificates have arrived, and a subscription will be given away at the next regular meeting.

Twelve SASE's have been sent to World Radio so that will send us new calls licensed in our area and change of address of existing Hams.

Information about B-VARC has been submitted for use by Ham Radio Helpline. We received a promotional brochure from them and have made 300 copies. They are attempting to get permission to place the brochures in local Radio Shack stores.

The Sidewalk Sale held on the third Saturday of each month was adopted by the club as an official B-VARC club sponsored event. Bill Hickox, K5BDZ, will be the Chairman of this monthly event.

One hundred dollars (as in past years) was invested as seed money with Houston Hamvention for the event to be held in November. A 25% return was earned last year.

A letter was received from the Fort Bend Parks and Recreation department stating that only fifty-five people and nine tables would be allowed in our meeting room at the Fire Station. Since this will not allow us to have certain functions or accomodate growth of the club, Ralph Cheek, KB5DNT, volunteered to chair a committee to look for a new meeting place. Bill Dessens, N5KXU, volunteered to assist in the search.

A letter written to ARRL requesting assistance in the organization of our club's fifteenth anniversary next year was returned with brief notes in the margins, but with no assistance offered. The intent is to make this anniversary very special.

The Rules Committee's recommendation to change the Dr. Bill award was returned to the committee for additional study. The following change will be made in the written criteria for awarding the Order of the Key award: "The Order of the Key is the highest honor to be conferred by B-VARC."

The Field Day committee is meeting May 14th. All is going well.

Hurricane Season is Approaching

The 1991 hurricane season began June 1st, and we are hearing predictions of an active tropical weather season. Many amateur radio operators provided assistance to their communities during past hurricanes and tropical storms, but there are others who did not. It wasn't that these operators didn't want to help. They even volunteered on local nets to assist if needed, but some of these volunteers found their offers of assistance declined.

The problem was that these amateur operators were not affiliated with their local ARES or RACES groups. The ARES and RACES groups participate in nets and training drills year round. When an emergency situation develops, these emergency groups are ready to respond with a trained group of volunteers. It is too late to train new members when a hurricane enters the Gulf. For that reason, last minute offers of assistance from radio operators not affiliated with ARES or RACES are sometimes turned down.

Many of these radio amateurs feel anger or disappointment when their offers of assistance are declined. I can understand their feelings from personal experience. I once volunteered to assist after a flood struck Tulsa, Oklahoma, in 1978. I had only been licensed for a few months, and because I had not been active in the local RACES group, my offer was declined. I joined the local RACES group the next month.

I encourage any members of B-VARC who are not active in ARES or RACES to become affiliated with these groups. The next time our community is facing a disaster, don't feel like you are on the outside looking in. Fort Bend County, Harris County, and the City of Houston have active ARES/RACES programs, and many B-VARC members participate in them. Now is the time to become involved in these groups.
