Field day is to begin with a Saturday morning breakfast at 8:00 and will formally commence at 13:00 hours that day. There will be a catered dinner Saturday evening.

Hurricane Season is Upon Us

Every year for the past several years I have had an article in the June B-VARC *Bulletin* regarding the need for amateur radio operators to become involved in emergency communications. The need for communications assistance is often very high in times of severe weather, and with the June 1st start of the 1992 hurricane season, it is time again to consider one of the ways that you may help your community.

We often hear stories about amateur radio operators who have helped their communities in time of need. However, I am going to write about a number of amateur operators who did not provide assistance. It wasn't that these operators didn't want to help. They even volunteered on local nets to assist if needed. But, many of these volunteers found their offers of assistance politely declined.

The problem was that these amateur operators were not affiliated with their local ARES or RACES groups. The ARES and RACES groups participate in nets and training drills year round. When an emergency situation develops, these emergency groups are ready to respond with a trained group of operators. It is too late to train new members when a hurricane enters the Gulf. For that reason, offers of assistance from radio amateurs not affiliated with ARES or RACES have sometimes been declined.

Many of these radio amateurs felt anger or disappointment when their offers of assistance were declined. I can understand their feelings from personal experience. I once volunteered to assist after a flood struck Tulsa, Oklahoma, in 1978. I had only been a licensed amateur for a few months, and because I had not been active in the local RACES group, my offer was declined. I joined the local RACES group the next month.

I encourage any members of B-VARC who are not active in ARES or RACES to become affiliated with these groups. Next time our community is faced with a disaster, don't feel like you are on the outside looking in. Both Fort Bend County and the City of Houston have active ARES/RACES programs, and many B-VARC members participate in them.

The first step to assist your community in times of severe weather is to attend a severe weather workshop. The Fort Bend County Office of Emergency Management is offering such a workshop on the evenings of June 8-9, 1992, from 7 to 10 pm at the

George Memorial Library in Richmond, Texas. This free in-depth workshop will cover severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, hurricanes, tropical storms, and flooding. A workshop schedule appears below. Further information may be obtained from Ron Bolyard, KA5GYG, at the Fort Bend County Office of Emergency Management at (713) 341-4430.
