MERA REPEATER GUIDELINES

The Memorial Emergency Radio Association (M.E.R.A.) is responsible for the day to day operation of any and all repeaters operated under the auspices of the Association.

The following guidelines are to be observed while using a M.E.R.A. repeater and any enhancements.

- M.E.R.A. repeaters are QSO PRIORITY machines
- Emergency traffic takes priority over regular QSO's
- Normal QSO's should stop when the repeater is in emergency use.

If anyone has any comments or suggestions on the operation of the M.E.R.A. repeater or repeaters, please contact the appropriate trustee. If you still need additional clarification, please contact another board member so that additional consideration could be given.

AUTOPATCH GUIDELINES FOR THE 145.47 REPEATER

- The Autopatch will be run as a 'FREE SUBSCRIPTION' autopatch
- No monetary consideration is necessary to be granted an autopatch access code which is renewable on January 1st of each year.
- Autopatch access codes will be assigned after an application has been completed in full and approved.
- Autopatch access codes should be kept confidential. DO NOT GIVE OUT YOUR ACCESS CODE.
- All autopatch calls are limited to THREE (3) MINUTES, except emergencies.
- All emergency traffic, including autopatch use, takes precedence over normal, two way conversations.
- All emergency speed dial numbers will be publicized and can be given out freely to ANYONE who needs them
- When using the autopatch, make sure that the party you are calling understands that they are on the the Amateur Radio Service and are expected to abide by FCC RULES (Part 97) and by these guidelines.
- If you are on hold and music is heard - HANG UP IMMEDIATELY.
- Routine autopatch use should be limited to 'off peak' hours or times when there is minimal activity on the repeater.
- Please be courteous to other users. Monitor the repeater for activity. Request permission to use the patch. Keep your call short. Identify the person you call before the patch is terminated. Identify by using your call sign. Thank the other users for the privilege.
- No calls of a business nature are allowed.
- You may dial a number for anyone and bring the patch down when they are through.
- No toll or calling card calls will be permitted.
- The M.E.R.A. Board and repeater Trustee reserve the right to revoke the privilege of using the autopatch for any user, at any time, for any reason
